


Extreme - More Than Words






Waiting to Exhale






Two Weeks Later








The "Great Recession" of 2007

Survey Says: Concentrated Losses

Top 3 losses in employment by number of jobs (May2020 to May2019):

- Accommodation and Food Services, -18,400 jobs
- Retail Trade, -7,700 jobs
- Health Care and Social Assistance, -6,200 jobs (this would include daycares, dentist offices, etc.)

Top 3 losses in employment by percent of jobs (May2020 to May2019):

- Accommodation and Food Services, -56.1%
- Arts, Entertainment & Recreation, -34.8% (equates to a loss of 1,600 jobs over the year)
- Construction, -26.1% (equates to a loss of 4,000 jobs over the year)




Ul rates – not as helpful

- Definitional challenges
- -One-month lag relative to claims data
- -Small sample size limiting data on groups
 - Volatility

Unemployment Rates





EMPLOYERS' HIERARCHY OF NEEDS TM






EMPLOYERS' HIERARCHY OF NEEDS TM




